# **Curation and Exhibition: Stories of Direction**

**Curation** is the process of selecting, organizing and displaying objects or works of art in a museum, art gallery, or other physical space for an audience.

**Exhibition** is the presentation of curated works.

**Directions**: Work with a team of 3 or 4 to write a proposal for how we should curate and exhibit the Stories of Direction Project. The winning proposal will be critiqued and revised into our final exhibition plan. The winning team will receive +5 bonus points. All teams that meet all the criteria below will receive full credit.

## **Your Curation Proposal must:**

- Clearly display one of the Project themes (culture shock, exploration, journey, frontier)
- Include a written explanation of the Project
- Include a project title, class, and date (e.g. Stories of Direction, PBL 10, 2019-2020)

## Your Exhibition Proposal must:

- Involve roles for 10 students
- Include a written invitation or flier
- Feature the Flash Narratives
- Feature the paper boat curation

#### Selecting a Winner:

 After all ideas have been presented, we'll use a Gallery Walk to select the winning idea for the class exhibition.
